Hungary as a new EU member state experienced a wave of investments in water industry during the past few years increasing the coverage of sewerage and communal wastewater treatment from 50% to 75% in a brief period. Solving the problems of ammonium and arsenic will provide safe and healthy drinking water for approximately 2 million people. However, some regions face long term strategic problems, such as the decrease of drinking water resources, their protection, limited surface water availability that leads to increasing water prices, global hydro-climate changes, arsenic and ammonium contamination.

This conference will provide an excellent opportunity for YWPs to present their latest research and network with their peers; so I invite you to begin preparing those papers that will form the technical programme of the conference.

One example for its ongoing success is the biennial International Young Water Professional Conference. This conference has grown from strength to strength, evident in the growing attendance numbers from 25 participants in

2002 in Cranfield, to 220 in 2008 in Berkeley and nearly 200 participants attending the most recent conference in Sydney, Australia in 2010. At the Budapest's YWP Congerence we aim to build on these numbers and provide a forum for young researchers and professionals in water and wastewater science,to present their work and meet their peers in multi-disciplinary fields of water research to further career development.

In addition to the International YWP Conference series, the YWP programme also hosts and coordinates regional workshops and national conferences all over the world. Outline Paper Submission

Outline papers will be considered for platform presentation and for poster presentation.

Outline papers should be limited to two A4 pages (including figures and tables) and must contain sufficient information to allow a proper review.

The following information must be included with each submission:

- Author(s) Name and Affiliation
- Title of paper
- Type of presentation (Platform or Poster)
- Email Address, Mailing Address and Telephone and Fax numbers

Outline papers must be submitted online using the conference website. Formatting guidelines for outline papers can be found at www.iwa-ywpc.org

Outline paper submissions are welcome from 15 July 2011 and must be received by 31 October 2011. Submitted outline papers will be reviewed by the Program Committee to select papers for platform and poster presentation. Authors will be notified by 16 December 2011. If selected, a full 8-page paper must be submitted by 15 March 2012.

At least one YP author of each selected platform paper and poster must register and attend the conference to present the paper.

Prizes will be awarded for the best platform papers and posters. Consideration will be given to publishing edited conference proceedings through IWA.

- Notification of selection: 16 December 2011
- Full papers due: 15 March 2012
